

Venue and places to see around:

The Conference will be held at IGCAR, Kalpakkam, which is located at about 75 km south of Chennai, the capital of Tamil Nadu. It is also very close to Mamallapuram, a famous tourist spot. Mamallapuram is famous for its monolithic rock

carvings, Krishna's butter ball, Descent of Ganges (Arjuna's Penance), Elephant rock, built largely between the 7th and 9th centuries, and has been classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Other places of site seeing located near Mamallapuram are Shore temples and Sea Shell Museum. Puducherry (also known as 'Quintessence of French Culture') situated about 80 Km south of Kalpakkam was a famous port city and an erstwhile French colony. Kanchipuram, famous for its temples and silk saris, is about 65 kms north-west of Kalpakkam.

How to reach?

It takes about 2 hours to reach Kalpakkam from Chennai by state transport bus and about 1:30 hours by taxi. All northbound trains are terminated at Chennai, Dr. M.G.R Central Railway Station and Southbound trains at Chengalpattu Railway Junction and Egmore Railway Station. The nearest Airport is located at Tirusulam, Chennai (Kamaraj Domestic Terminal and Anna International Terminal).

Foreign Delegates

Kindly note that foreign delegates are allowed to enter the conference premises with a valid conference/business visa only. Confirmation of participation of foreign delegates for attending the Conference is subject to clearance from the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE), Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) and Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA). Accommodation
